Artist Statement

After the physical body is gone an imprint remains.

The artwork I create is lifted directly from life experience and depicts loss and emptiness as subject matter. Although I approach the topic from the perspective of a private grief and the space left vacant in my personal domestic life, the subject of loss can be recognized as a universal.

When a person succumbs to old age or sickness, to some degree, that passing was anticipated and is surrounded with ritual. In contrast, when a person is suddenly absent, nothing is predicted and what follows is cessation.

Meticulous surface textures engage my hands but free my mind for lamentation. I consciously engage in time elapsed acts and repetitive motions: sewing up seams, tying loose threads, germinating plants from seeds, and other re-enacted ceremonies. It is my attempt to seal and foster the past and counteract eventual deterioration.
