Achievement: While planning and implementing my first exhibit, I noticed that many viewers were offering feedback that indicated that they didn't understand the purpose and relevancy of displays featuring Aboriginal Art within Aboriginal Affairs and Northern Development Canada building complex. In order to challenge viewers to engage more with exhibits and ask questions, I developed guided tours and interpretation text panels for each new display. This new procedure was successful in allowing viewers to ask difficult questions about the artwork and hear multiple viewpoints, alleviating any confusion or misreading of artwork displays. Since these changes, I have received an overflow of positive feedback and more interest in having additional displays within the complex. This exemplifies my ability to deliver, design and modify curriculum based on student needs / program feedback.

Achievement: Outreaching to youth was one of the main challenges my director presented to me on facilitating employment programming for you. Naturally, after a long day at school, it can be difficult to entice youth and young adults to work on job skills. I took on the challenge and created an outreach strategy that targeted youth through familiar imagery on posters and social media, as well as in person at schools, bus stops and community groups. We exceeded our attendance target in only one month and were able to assist over 800 youth in the 4 months of the program.

Achievement: It can be challenging to design courses to meet the needs of a variety of students with different skill levels and abilities. The Introductory Digital Photography course attracted a variety of students including retirees, young professionals and hobbyists, all with different goals. I developed the curriculum and assignments with greater flexibility for the student, allowing them to exercise their

creative muscles at a pace that suited their time commitment and skill level. I also found that in class hands-on learning activities helped to bridge skill gaps quickly and allow for collaborative learning.
