Statement

My work explores the use of architecture and the natural terrain as strong influence in the transmission of cultural values, beliefs and philosophies. Utilizing an interdisciplinary approach, my work is often site-specific, sensually immersive, and deeply connected to the environment, landscape and unique history I am working with.

Combining the use of sound, video, drawing, and sculptural form, I create a sensory experience for my audience. Heightening a sense of familiarity, I record and manipulate both sound and image found in the community and landscape. These recordings are layered and assimilated into an installation space.



Drawings are also an important component of my process, and set a starting point for engaging with observations. An act of perceptual thinking, drawing helps decipher spacial relationships, tone, emotional language and patterns of activity within the context of the site or greater locale. Through this process, each work becomes an extension of drawing, a spatial and physical manifestation of its language.

The use of found materials collected from the natural environment, is an ongoing theme in the construction of both installations and sculptural works. Branches and vines become a systematic growth of line into form, while the use of soil, wood, and clay shape mass and volume. This process of working is organic and responsive, each mark, whether on paper or in physical space, depends of the previous for direction and purpose.

Moving towards completion, each work becomes an active and sensually contained environment resonanting and articulating its surroundings. Within these environments, I position the viewer within the liminal space of activity, simultaneously the onlooker and participant.

Candice Ivy is a multi-media artist from South Carolina interested in perception and the sensorial experience of the body. She received her BFA in Fine Arts from Coker College in 1999 and her MFA from the School of the Museum of Fine Arts/Tufts University, Boston, MA in 2006. Her multimedia works have been shown both nationally and internationally including *Murmur* in the Old City Jail in Charleston, SC as a part of the Piccolo Spoleto Festival, in the Sguardi Sonori Festival in Venice, Benevento, and Frascati, Italy, the Universidad Catolica in Santiago, Chile, as a part of Urban

Occupations Urbaines in Montreal, Canada, and at the Taipei Artist's Village, Taipei, Taiwan. Ivy's video work has been shown in such venues as Boston University 808 Gallery, The Museum of Fine Arts, Boston, MA, the Rhode Island International Film Festival, Providence, RI, and The Berkeley Small Film Festival, Berkeley, CA.

In Fall 2014, she constructed *Deluge*, a 20 foot tall cascade of black glass sourced from broken car windshields at the Davis Museum, Wellesley, MA, And in 2015, Ivy produced a large community wide public art performance in front of the SC state capitol for the Sesquicentennial Anniversary of the Civil War in Columbia, SC. She is currently a recipient of the of the Saint Gaudens Memorial Fellowship and is producing work for a site-specific installation located at the Saint Gauden's historic site in Cornish, NH.

Ivy currently teaches at Boston College and the Massachusetts College of Art and Design. She is also currently a Visiting Lecturer at Wellesley College, and Director of the College's exhibition space, the Jewett Art Gallery.
