Gunjan Kumar is born and raised in Punjab, India. She is a textile graduate from National Institute of Design and Technology, New Delhi and has worked in textile industry for almost a decade. She has keen interest in indigenous methods, archeology, pre-historic and tribal arts and has traveled extensively exploring her interest in these areas. These experiences form the undertone of her art practice. Self taught in arts, she uses ground earth and minerals like shell oysters, clay, calcium carbonate, turmeric etc. as her core mediums, applied on Japanese Mulberry paper, using a self-developed technique inspired by traditional methods. She is a fellow at the Edward Albee Foundation (2016 – 2017), New York. In 2017, her works have been showcased at the Ukrainian Institute of Modern Art, Chicago Art Department and Donnelley Foundation in Chicago and at a solo show at Victorian Art Gallery, Bourbonnais, Illinois. Kumar lives and works in Chicago. Gallery Exhibit 320 will show a body of her works at the India Art fair 2018.
