During his time in art school his work was celebrated and won awards for excellence in drawing, painting and watercolor. His student work sold in local galleries. He graduated from Lamar Tech (now Lamar University) in Beaumont, Texas at the top of his class in art and design – leaving the Beaumont area to pursue a vocation in illustration and graphic design.

Ronald had a distinguished career in graphics, including gold and silver medals in the New York Art Directors show. He has had much of his work selected for publication in Graphis, Print and Communication Arts Magazines as well as being asked to judge Communication Arts and American Institute of Graphic Arts competitions. Ronald has been invited to be a visiting lecturer and teacher in the design departments of universities in the DFW area. He has also been invited as a guest speaker to many professional design organizations throughout the U.S. His work has been selected as an example of superlative graphic arts in numerous publications now on the shelves of libraries and book stores all over America. Ronald was awarded the Dallas Society of Visual Communications' most prestigious honor, the Golden Egg, in 1995. This is given to individuals in the DFW area for an extraordinary career of creative contribution who have brought honor and attention to their profession through recognition of their work nationally and internationally.

Over the past five years Ronald has redirected the focus of his creative endeavors, reaching back to his early years, in pursuit of his lifelong interest in painting, drawing and creating with his hands.
